| <p style="text-align: center;"><u>CARING Kindergartners</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪Make a card of appreciation to show you care for our police or fire department for all they do to help keep us safe. Your card will be administered to those individuals. ▪Create a poster that shows random acts of kindness, particularly in caring for others. | <p style="text-align: center;"><u>RESPECTFUL 1st Graders</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪Make a list of 10 ways you can show respect to others. Then draw a picture on the back demonstrating one of the ways. ▪Create a poster that contains the Golden Rule. Your poster may be displayed in the school. |
| <p style="text-align: center;"><u>FAIR 2nd Graders</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪List 10 ways you can show fairness toward others. Then, share two ways you have shown good character by being fair. ▪Create a poster with suggestions on ways someone can show fairness. Your poster will be displayed in the school. | <p style="text-align: center;"><u>RESPONSIBLE 3rd Graders</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪Create a responsibility chart with at least five tasks on it. Use the chart and demonstrate responsibility for two weeks. Have your parent/guardian sign the chart. ▪Write a full-page story of how you did something that demonstrated responsible actions, and how that made you feel. Don't forget to use detail. |
| <p style="text-align: center;"><u>TRUSTING 4th Graders</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪Create a detailed brochure on the importance of "trustworthiness." Your brochure may be used to give to other students who need help in this area. ▪Write a one full-page and a half story of how you did something to demonstrate that you are a trusting person, and how that made you feel. Don't forget to use detail. | <p style="text-align: center;"><u>5th Grade CITIZENS</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪With the help of an adult, make/bake something for the police or fire department to show your appreciation for helping to keep us safe. ▪Do community service for one of your neighbors (rake their leaves, shovel their driveway, etc.) and then write a half page summary on what you did and how that person felt. Include a parent/guardian signature. |

These activities are optional. Should students wish to participate in completing one of the activities that represents their pillar, they may place it in the Character Counts mailbox outside the office or, if it doesn't fit, take it into the office. Students will be recognized in various ways, including treats, name announced on announcements, activity displayed in school, etc. Most importantly, students will feel good about doing something, above and beyond, that demonstrates good character!
